Subject: LETTER OF SUPPORT FOR AB754

Dear Governor Brown:

As a former city mayor, you must be aware of the high cost of compliance with NPDES Stormwater requirements. These costs will only increase in the future while the ability to raise revenues has been limited by the passage of Proposition 218.

In front of you right now is an opportunity to improve the situation. On behalf of the Ventura Countywide Stormwater Quality Management Program (Program), I am writing to request that you sign AB754. The Program includes the cities of Camarillo, Fillmore, Moorpark, Ojai, Oxnard, Port Hueneme, Ventura, Santa Paula, Simi Valley, and Thousand Oaks, the County of Ventura, and the Ventura County Watershed Protection District.

AB754 will allow taxpayers to make a contribution to the California Beach and Coastal Enhancement Account (CBCEA) when filing their state income tax return. These contributions would support the California Coastal Commission's Whale Tail Grants Program which funds programs important to our State's coastal and marine environment. It is one of the few grant programs available for environmental education and coastal conservation such as California Coastal Cleanup Day, an annual volunteer event that brings together thousands of volunteers in Ventura County to pick up trash from local parks, beaches, and waterways. This important event not only educates the public about the widespread issue of trash pollution, but also makes the public part of the solution.

Although the Program has accomplished a great deal over the past 15 years, there is much more to be done. Additional funds from contributions through California tax returns would help to close this gap and would provide Californians who value coastal conservation and education a simple way to support this cause.
