Attached via email is the Annual Report pursuant to the requirements of the Ventura County Municipal Stormwater NPDES Permit No. CAS004002/Order No. 10-108 which requires an Annual Storm Water Report (Report) be submitted by December 15th of each year. This Report discusses the Permittees' Permit compliance activities for the period of July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018 and includes a description of all activities conducted during the reporting period, an assessment of the Ventura Countywide Stormwater Program's effectiveness, and an evaluation of pollutants detected through the Stormwater Monitoring Program.

This Annual Report was prepared with the cooperation and assistance of the Ventura Countywide Permittees which includes the cities of Camarillo, Fillmore, Moorpark, Ojai, Oxnard, Port Hueneme, Ventura, Santa Paula, Simi Valley, Thousand Oaks, the County of Ventura, and the Ventura County Watershed Protection District. Each Permittee contributed detailed Permit compliance information and data regarding their various stormwater programs.

Some notable accomplishments by the Program and the Permittees this reporting period include:

- Beach water quality in Ventura County was once again among the best in the state.



- Coordination of the Ventura County Coastal Cleanup Day Event, recruiting 3,313 volunteers to 26 different beaches and inland locations, collecting 12,900 pounds of trash.
- Adoption of a new Ventura Countywide Stormwater Quality Management Program Mission Statement to build countywide continuity and purpose.
- Creation and distribution communication tools to inform the highest levels of management about the potential programmatic and financial impacts of a new Permit including a new Program brochure to effectively communicate our goals, accomplishments and value.
- A comprehensive all-day training workshop on current Ventura County stormwater quality post construction requirements for city and county planning, engineering, inspection, and operations and maintenance staff. The entire training is now available online.
